

PARK RULES

1 Adhere to Park entry and exit times. Unless you are an overnight visitor, always exit the park before dusk. Park gates open at 6:00 am and close at 6:00 pm.

2 General rules of the road apply. Car hooting and driving under the influence of alcohol is strictly prohibited.

3 Move slowly and quietly but remember all animals are wild and can react dangerously if startled.



All KWS parks, reserves and sanctuaries are SINGLE USE PLASTIC FREE ZONES.

Personal effects, clean drinking water, camera, binoculars, sunscreen, insect repellent and first aid kit.




HOW TO GET THERE

INTRODUCTION

In the vast arid wilderness north of Meru National Park lies the Bisanadi National Reserve that acts as a wildlife dispersal area for Meru National Park and is part of the Mwingi, Meru, Kora, and Bisanadi conservation area.

Located on the border of Meru National Park known as 'Kinna' the border between Meru and Bisanadi Parks is the traditional division between the Meru and Borana people.

KEY ATTRACTIONS & ACTIVITIES

The hot and arid bush land is host to many species of mammals including lions, elephants, cheetahs, rhinos, buffalos and over 400 species of birds.


The reserve is dotted with scenic wilderness habitats ideal for game viewing, fishing, sight seeing and boating on River Tana and Rojewero River. Nature and wilderness lovers will be delighted in camping under the stars in this remote but breathtaking space.
