# INTRODUCTION

From tangles of dense undergrowth of the semi-arid desert, dust red elephants leisurely take charge of the vast park. Tsavo East lies to the east of the Nairobi - Mombasa high way, an equidistant between Nairobi and Mombasa, and offers a vast and untapped arena of arid bush which is washed by the azure and emerald meanderings of the Galana River, guarded by the limitless lava reaches of the Yatta Plateau, the longest lava flow in the world and patrolled by some of the largest elephant herds in Kenya.

The park forms the largest protected area in Kenya and is home to most of the larger mammals, vast herds of dust-red elephant, Rhino, buffalo, lion, leopard, hyena, hippo, crocodile, waterbucks, lesser Kudu, gerenuk and hirola. The park is also an ornithological paradise that attracts migrating birds from all over the world. The prolific bird life features 500 recorded species.



# KEY ATTRACTIONS & ACTIVITIES

Best described as **elephants in Eden**, and without a care in the wild world, the massive and mighty mammals wallow, roll and spray each other with the midnight blue waters of the palm-shaded Galana River. This must be one of the most evocative images of Africa.


The beautiful Aruba dam located to the north bank of the seasonal Voi River is visited by thousands of animals in the park and makes a great game viewing destination.



**Mudanda rock** is a whale-backed rock that towers above a natural dam. This rock formation runs for over 1.5km and it attracts elephants in the dry season and is a reminiscent of Australia's Uluru (Ayers Rock), albeit on a much smaller scale. Leopards and elephants are among the wildlife to watch out for here. The waterhole underneath the rock attracts several other wildlife species.

**Lugard's Falls** named after Captain Lugard, the first proconsul to East Africa, the falls feature a bizarrely eroded rock neck through which the waters of Galana River plunge into foaming rapids and crocodile infested pools.

A spectacular voyage of discovery, Tsavo East National Park offers some of the most magnificent game drives in the world – vast herds of dust-red elephants, fat pods of hippos, giant crocodiles and a kaleidoscope of bird life are set against a blazing backdrop of endless bush.



# WHAT TO TAKE WITH YOU

Also important are; Camera, binoculars, sunscreen, insect repellent, first aid kit, sunglasses and reserve car fuel if intending to be in the park longer, drinking water, food, camping equipment if intending to camp.



# HOW TO GET THERE



**By Air:** Main Airstrips; Voi and Ithumba. Other airstrips include; Aruba, Satao, Sala, Sangayaya, Thabagunji, Luggards and Bachuma.

**By Road:** Bachuma gate 110kms, Voi -156kms and Manyani gates -191kms from Mombasa all located along the Mombasa – Nairobi highway. Mtito Andei Gate is located 233 km South of Nairobi and 250 km North of Mombasa on the main Nairobi- Mombasa Road. From Malindi, take the western tarmac road (C103) and access the park via Sala gate.



**By Rail:** Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) from Syokimau Nairobi Terminus to Voi train station.

# PARK RULES

Adhere to Park entry and exit times. Unless you are an overnight visitor, always exit the park before dusk. Park gates open at 6:00 am and close at 6:00 pm.

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General rules of the road apply. Car hooting and driving under the influence of alcohol is strictly prohibited.



Move slowly and quietly but remember all animals are wild and can react dangerously if startled.

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All KWS parks, reserves and sanctuaries are SINGLE USE PLASTIC FREE ZONES.
